Following the sad news shared last week regarding the death of Miss Williams-Jones, I wanted to thank you sincerely for the many messages of support, kind words and flowers that have been left at the school gate. Your thoughtfulness has meant a great deal to all of us during this difficult time.

Some of the flowers left outside have started to wilt in the sunshine, so we have brought them inside the school where they can continue to be appreciated by staff and pupils.

Mrs Merfield and I have visited all the classes through the day and spoken to children from Year 2 upwards, responding to any questions and offering reassurance. Additional support has been available for those pupils who needed it and we will continue to provide that where needed. We recognise that everyone processes grief differently and may need support at different times.

This continues to be an extremely challenging period for our whole school community. We would therefore ask for your patience and understanding if responses to emails or enquiries relating to other matters take a little longer than usual over the coming days.

Miss Williams-Jones had been off work in the period prior to her death and a supply teacher, Miss Abraham-Jones has been in their class for most of this time. She will continue to be their class teacher for the foreseeable future.

Thank you again for your kindness, support and understanding. A few parents have expressed a wish to bring flowers to the site, if you would like to please bring them to the office.
